It has been officially just over a year now since I began as your pastor! I recently had to go meet with our District Superintendent, Lance Clay, to visit with him on how things are going. He looked at me the minute we got seated and said, "I don't have a lot to say, you're growing, numbers are up, ministry is happening." And he's right. We are growing. The amount of faces in the congregation on a Sunday morning is phenomenal! As of August 1st, our average attendance on a Sunday morning since the first of the year is 91 people, and that's adding in a Sunday we canceled church due to snow. I don't care what you say. Yes, there is something to be said for the leadership of the pastor, but I alone can only do so much. I can help set vision, but it takes the people of the church to put that vision into action and that is you. Ephesians 4.11-13 says this,

"11The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ."

It takes all of us to be the Body of Christ. We have new families joining the church. We have youth starting Confirmation. We have youth going to Camp and Conference Youth Events. We have children coming out of the woodwork to attend VBS, and coming up on Sunday mornings for Holy Wiggle Time. We are doing weekly devotions with other parents and pastors at the High School and Junior High School. We have a Depression Support Group meeting here weekly, meeting a need in our Community. We have a Yoga Class meeting spiritual, emotional and physical needs on a weekly basis. The list goes on and on and on. You guys are amazing. And I told Lance, "I serve a God who is a God of the Impossibles, and a church that is ready to be in ministry in our community." I can't do anything on my own. You can't do anything on your own. With Christ, we can meet the needs of our community, and further God's Kingdom. My hope and prayer, now that we're in this second year together, is that we can continue to grow together and be the Body of Christ in our Mission Field of Superior, Nebraska.

Administrative Council - July

The Administrative Council of the United Methodist Church met on July 22, 2018 at the Church. Present: Patty Studer, Marsha Ray, Jana Marr, Twig Studer, Darlene Hale, Jo Wilbern, Arnold Ross, Phyllis Ross, Steve Fox, Karen Fox, and Pastor Natalie Faust. Marsha called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. The minutes of the May 22, 2018 meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

Finance: Marsha distributed a financial report to the Board comparing 2017 to 2018. The Board discussed placing a financial report in the monthly Herald. Natalie, the summer intern, received a \$500.00 budget from the District to help pay for her mileage and other Church related activities. She has exceeded that amount by about \$400.00. A motion was made by Arnold and seconded by Patty for the Church to pay her an extra \$100.00 to help make up the difference. It was stated that the other churches she interns at could help her with the rest Motion was carried.

Trustees: The air conditioner in the Sanctuary needed a part which cost \$800.00. The sprinkler system on the north side of the Church had been hitting the unit and caused the need for the replacement part. B-Green has adjusted the sprinkler heads in the area. The back screen door leading into the kitchen has been replaced. Memorial: A six foot bench in memory of Merwyn Wyatt will be placed on the south side of the sidewalk in front of the Church's entryway as soon as a concrete pad is placed. SPPRC: A replacement for Mary Ray is needed for the SPPRC committee. The Church will have to contact Lance Clay for the correct procedure to use to announce the replacement. Dan McKeown was hired as the new custodian and he is doing a great job.

Sunday, September 30, 2018 there will be a meeting at the Trinity United Methodist Church in Grand Island, NE at 2:30 p.m. Bishop Saenz Jr. will discuss upcoming changes that are going to take place in the United Methodist Church. 
