
New Members

Administrative Council

The Administrative Council of the United Methodist Church met on September 23, 2018. Present: Beverly Beavers, Marsha Ray, Sue Guilkey. Jeff Guilkey, Sue Rose, Patty Studer, Jana Marr, and Pastor Natalie Faust. Beverly called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and Pastor Natalie opened the meeting with a prayer. The minutes of the July 22, 2018 meeting were reviewed. Patty made a motion to accept the minutes as submitted. Sue Guilkey seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Finance-Beverly distributed the proposed 2019 Church Budget to the Board members. Motion made by Jeff and seconded by Sue Rose to accept the proposed budget. Motion carried.

Trustees-Jeff reported Merwyn Wyatt's memorial bench will be placed outside in front of the Church's sanctuary after a concrete pad is poured. Jeff also discussed the need for a new air conditioning unit for the sanctuary. Bids have been taken. The Trustees decided to to table the purchase until next spring since the need for air conditioning is over. The heating system could be used during the winter and the complete cooling and heating system could be replaced next spring. The bids received were \$14,000.00 Jeff also discussed having a mini-split unit installed in the back of the choir loft to help with temperature control in the Sanctuary. The mini-split unit would be at an additional cost.

UMW-Sue Rose reported the UMW Sunday will be held on Sunday,

October 21, 2018. The group will not be selling the Teri Lynn Nut Products this year. Bill and Mary Hamilton are in charge of Harvest Festival.

Pastor's Report-Pastor Natalie reported that the Church will host "Trunk or Treat" on Saturday, October 27, 2018 from 4:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m., which will be open to the community. The new picture directory is almost ready to be printed. The 2018 Charge Conference will be hosted by the Church on Tuesday, October 16, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. All Church members are welcome to attend. Sunday Funday and confirmation classes have started. The children will sing once a month during the second service after Holy Wiggle Time. The Christmas

The SPPRC is debating over whether to purchase a van or to rent one when it is needed. Patty is going to check the cost of insurance and who could drive the van. Pastor Natalie and Patty said they are both comfortable driving a van that size. Meeting adjourned at 10:05 a.m.
