-Included with every program at no cost


- -Access your families' information from any device


What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus Christ?

Administrative Council

The Administrative Council of the United Methodist Church met on December 18, 2018 at the Church. Present: Beverly Beavers, Sue Rose, Linda Cox, Jana Marr, Patty Studer, Judy Corman, Esther Martin, Jeff Guilkey, Sue Guilkey, and Pastor Natalie Faust. The minutes of the September 25, 2018 meeting were reviewed. Pastor Natalie opened the meeting with prayer.

The first item on the agenda was electing Beverly Beavers as Ad Council Chairman. A motion was made by Sue Rose and seconded by Sue Guilkey to name Beverly as Ad Council Chairman. Motion carried. Beverly called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Trustees

Jeff had received preliminary estimates from both Scott's TV & Appliance & Scott Wittke Heating on replacing the heating and air system in the sanctuary. Both were approximately \$15,000.00. The memorial bench for Merwyn Wyatt will be placed when the weather is warm enough to pour the concrete. The ceiling at the parsonage has been repaired. There was a water issue at the parsonage in Jaimey's bedroom. The rain and snow melt on the north side does not drain properly from the outside wall. The siding was removed and the area was sealed for now, this it is a temporary fix, more work will need to be done at a later date. The floor by the elevator in the fellowship hall is scheduled to be repaired by Dave Christiancy. The floor of the closet in the fellowship hall will have to be removed to see what is underneath before any repair can be made. Esher Martin indicated the closet needs to be cleaned out and the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts should use the shelves designated for them. Pastor Natalie reported that someone had been in the Happy Time Preschool room and had moved posters around and a bluetooth speaker is missing. The Trustees will try to find a way to lock the doors so they are not open all the time. The thermostats in Natalie's office and in the Kate Lyne Chapel have been replaced. Pastor Natalie will place a note in the bulletin regarding the importance of keeping the utility bills in check during the winter months. The thermostats are set on a time schedule and if you need to change them remember to reset them in the room when you leave. Please remember to shut off the lights also.

Education

Children's Sunday school has been well attended. Linda Cox reported she usually has 12 adults in her class. A 4 week Bible Study has been completed. The class was led by Avis Shaw, Patty Studer, and Pastor Natalie.

Memorial

Sue Guilkey reported that Gail Ann Aurand would be joining the committee in January. Memorial funds were used to pay for the youth camp. New music will be purchased for the bell choirs and choir. New bell folders, stand, and table foam will also be purchased. Sue will ask the committee if they had funds to help with financing the new heat and air system in the sanctuary.

SPRC

Patty indicated since Dan McKeown has been having medical issues that Jessi has been doing the custodial work. Beverly suggested that Brian take Dan's Christmas gift to Webber on Sunday, December 23rd. Patty reported the review of the minister had been completed. Beverly asked if the Conference had a document that indicated pastors salary packages in the Conference. Pastor Natalie said it would be in the Conference's journal.

Pastor's report

A Youth Conference is scheduled in Salina, Ks at the Bicentennial Center. Eleven youth and 2 adults will be attending. Shannon McCord has donated the use of Ideal Market's van which he will drive and one car will be taken. The conference will pay for the mileage. Beverly Beavers will give the sermon on the first Sunday in January. Communion will be held the second Sunday of January. Pastor Natalie will be starting a 6 week sermon series in January on Commitment to Christ. The Christmas open house was well attended.

New Business

Beverly Beavers and Bill Hamilton will be placing the luminaries. The Board decided to tune the piano in the sanctuary every year and the fellowship hall piano and the Kate Lyne Chapel piano every 3 years.

The time and date of the Ad Council meetings were discussed. No decision made. Beverly will chair a Mission Soup Supper on Tuesday, February 26,2018 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.. Proceeds will go to the new heat and air system.

Sue Rose made a motion that the Christmas Eve offering be given to the Nuckolls County Food pantry. Judy Corman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor Natalie closed the meeting with prayer. Meeting adjourned at 8:07 p.m
