



Marsha called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and Pastor Natalie opened with prayer. The minutes off the March 19, 2019 meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

Finance:

Jana discussed the Church's current assets for the past month. Tithes and offerings were up. The elevator is currently not working. The repairman has been contacted, but he is on vacation and will be contacted again to come and repair it. Scott's TV and Appliance got the bid for the new heating and cooling system for the Sanctuary. \$11,000.00 has been donated towards the system. The Memorial Committee contribute \$5,000.00. The Foundation contributed \$2,000.00 and the remaining \$4,000.00 has been donated by the congregation. \$775.00 has been collected for Jaimey Bryant's scholarship. \$221.00 was collected for UMCOR and \$1353.00 was collected for the Flood Relief Fund.
