# Administrative Council

The Administrative Council met on September 17, 2019 at the Church. Present: Beverly Beavers, Marsha Ray, Patty Studier, Judy Corman, Shannon McCord, Pat McCord, Sue Rose, Carole Thompson, Linda Cox, Jana Marr, and Pastor Natalie Faust.

Beverly called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and opened with prayer. Marsha reviewed the minutes of the August 27, 2019 meeting. The minutes were approved as submitted.

#### Finance:

The current month's assets were reviewed. Shannon presented the Council with a bill of \$1630.00 for the repair of the entryways, both east and west, to the Educational Unit. Motion made by Carole Thompson to approve the bill, Seconded by Marsha Ray.

Motion carried. Shannon also presented a bill for the rental of a lift which was used to replace a missing piece of fascia on the roof of the Church. The rental fee was \$250.00 plus \$100.00 to fill the lift with gas for a total of \$350.00 A motion was made by Pat McCord to pay the bill. The motion was seconded by Judy Corman. The motion was carried. Both bills had already been paid by Shannon from Ideal Market and the Church will reimburse Ideal Market.

A bill from Scott's of \$1,000.00 was presented for a fresh air intake box for the new furnace and air in the Sanctuary. A motion was made by Linda Cox and seconded by Judy Corman to pay the bill. The motion was carried.

#### Trustees:

The awnings have been taken down at the parsonage. The footings will be dug in the basement of the parsonage to start the repair on the wall. A tentative date has been set for November 9th or 10th. There had been a higher than usual gas bill at the Church earlier in the summer. Jerred Ehlers checked for possible gas leaks, but found no abnormal readings. The Council discussed the purchasing of carbon dioxide detectors for the Church. An amp on the carillon was blown possibly due to defective wiring which will be checked. If the wiring is ok then the speakers will be checked. Bats have been a bad problem at the Church . An adult was bitten on 08-28-2019 in the basement when he picked one up off the floor. He is currently receiving the necessary medical treatment. The Trustees approved of hiring Jeff Hutchinson and Tami Mertens to attempt to seal up areas where the bats are getting into the Church.

The cost is \$2400.00. The lift that Tami has extends to 40 feet in height.

Shannon is going to secure a true estimate on a lift for the Church. It will use the same space as the elevator currently does. Shannon is also going to contact Windstream to see if they have any thought about a way to deter the buzzards from nesting next door to the Church.

He is also going to meet with Nate Saathoff on 09-18-2019 regarding replacing the cement in front of the Church and pouring the concrete pad for the Wyatt memorial bench.

#### UMW:

Carole reported that the group still needs someone to fill the vice president position. The Fall Pot Luck Supper will be at 6:00 p.m. on 09-18-2019. October 13, 2019 will be UMW Sunday at Church. Marsha Stauss will have the message. The Harvest Festival will be chaired by the Robert Brown family and will be held on 11-20-2019. There will be a funeral dinner for Larry Havens on 09-19-2019.

#### Memorial:

The new Bell Choir music and materials have been purchased. \$300.00 was given for memorials in honor of Gail Breen.

#### Sunday FunDay:

The attendance has been good the first two weeks.

#### SPRC:

Patty reported the committee has been working on next year's salaries for Pastor Natalie, Jessi Edwards, and Dan McKeown.

#### **Pastor's Report:**

Nominations Committee met on 09-15-2019. The Lay Leadership Committee of 2020 was submitted to the Council. A motion was made by Marsha and seconded by Judy to accept the nominations as submitted. Motion carried.

The Youth Fundraiser raised a little over \$800.00. They also received the \$1,000.00 grant from the Conference. Thirteen youth attended the first youth meeting. Todd and Chelsea Kramp are helping with the group. The youth space will still be used during Harvest Festival and funeral dinners. The rugs and the futons will be moved out of the way.

Pastor Natalie will be speaking to the various groups that use the Fellowship Hall during the week for their activities regarding proper behavior and rules expected of them while using the building. Pat McCord made a motion which was seconded by Judy Corman to draft a letter to the groups to clarify the expectations and boundaries of using the Church's facilities. It will also require the names of the adults that are in charge of the groups, the adults' phone numbers and the schedules of their meetings and events which should be turned into the office. Motion carried.

The Hurricane Relief Fund collected \$346.00

The Annual Charge Conference will be held on Sunday, October 20, 2019 at 2:00 p.m. Natalie Soukup and her Praise Band will be performing later that afternoon and a pot luck will be held. Saturday October 26, 2019 is the date scheduled for 'Trunk or Treat'.

Emily Tietjen has indicated that she will donate her time to paint the Fellowship Hall, if the Church will pay for the paint and supplies needed. The Hall will be painted in neutral tones with perhaps one accent wall. Motion made by Marsha and seconded by Patty to let Emily paint the Hall. Motion carried. Pastor Natalie closed the meeting with prayer. Meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.
