

Natalie's Notes

So on the first night of a new Bible Study, The Wesleyan Way, many years ago the leaders guide told me to be prepared to answer the following questions: Why are you a Christian? What does being a Christian mean to you?

I began thinking about those questions a lot over the next couple of days and at the end of the class I realized that the class didn't even ask me the questions! But I told them about the questions anyway. So then they asked me why I am a Christian. My answer, after prayer and after discernment, comes down to this: Because I know I am loved by God. But then I began to think about why I know I am loved by God, and what it does mean to me. The conclusion I've come to, (and this is a process, because all of being a Christian is a process) I can tell that God is taking care of me, and I praise and thank him for that. But what about when things in our lives are bad, when things are awful?

I realized that 9 years ago, when my life was falling apart in the midst of a failed marriage, and then again when my family was going through a traumatic event 6 years ago, that I turned to the only thing I knew I could possible count on without fail, God. That's how I know I'm a Christian. Even in the midst of pain and suffering, I sought help from the only person who could help. And God did what God does and comforted me.

Did God take the pain away, or change the fact that my marriage was over, or the traumatic event happened? No, but he eased the pain and gave me peace. When we are in the midst of tragedy, how do we seek solace? Who, or maybe what, do we turn to? David, in the Psalms cried out to God over and over again in his anguish and pain.


I'm reminded of the song by Casting Crowns, "And I'll praise You in this storm and I will lift my hands. For You are who You are, no matter where I am. And every tear I've cried you hold in Your hand. You never left my side and

though my heart is torn, I will praise You in this storm." I often tell people to have an elevator story ready, to be able to tell that story in an elevator ride. Well this is my elevator story of why I am a Christian, why I praise God, and what it means to me.

I encouraged my class then, and now I encourage you now, to think about that question: Why are you a Christian? You may surprise yourself...I certainly did.




